Sue Desmond-Hellmann Herceptin after 25 Years



Sue Desmond-Hellmann, MD, MPH has been a pioneer in biotech and cancer research for over 30 years. In addition to her role as President of Product Development at Genentech. she has served as the CEO of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, and Chancellor of the University of California, San Francisco. An oncologist by training, she has driven major advancements toward the eradication of disease, poverty, and inequity. She has treated and researched AIDS-related cancer in the U.S. and Uganda, and overseen the launch of world's first nonprofit biotech organization as well as the Economic Mobility and Opportunity investment strategy in the U.S.
